

We firmly believe in a diverse learning and playing environment – where children can develop an array of academic, social and interactive skills. Keeping in line with the Philani mission to promote child health, our learners also receive daily nourishing meals and snacks.

We are happy to report that our attendance continues to grow steadily - we now have approximately 290 children enrolled across 11 classes, with a staff compliment of 16 - including teachers, teaching assistants and cooks.

**Aspirations**: Hlumelo would like to become a doctor when he is older – his grandparents are fully supportive.






### Bukho Mlaka, 6 years old

**Background:** Sinuvuyo lives with her mother and one other sibling.

**Background**: Lihle lives with his mother, who is a single-parent and has been unemployed for two years.


**Aspirations**: Lihle's mother is thrilled that he loves coming to school and enjoys learning – she has a feeling he may become a teacher!

**Background**: Inathi lives in Crossroads with her grandmother who takes care of her.


**Aspirations**: Inathi loves to tell her grandmother what she has learned at school and would one day like to become a teacher.

**Aspirations**: Thando has told his mother that when he is older, he would like to study medicine to become a doctor


